RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits will be released Sunday evening from 8:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. Exhibitors must pick up premium monies during the fair on Sunday, July 21. No premium money will be available after August 1, 2019. All exhibits not picked up by 10:00 a.m. on Monday, July 22, 2019 will be disposed of.

Early removal of exhibits (unless approved by Ag Society) will result in loss of premium monies.
