RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits will be released Sunday evening from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m.; exhibits not picked up by 7:30pm on Sunday may be picked up on Monday starting at 9am. Exhibitors must pick up premium checks during the fair on Sunday, July 20. No premium money will be available after August 1, 2025. All exhibits not picked up by 11:00 a.m. on Monday, July 21, 2025 will be disposed of.

Early removal of exhibits (unless approved by Ag Society) will result in loss of premium monies.
